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Jenny Okun - Dreamscapes

Jenny Okun's trip to Lecce began in 1997, when she was known for her amazing photographic interpretations of modern and contemporary architecture - precise, layered abstractions obtained by manually advancing the film in the camera in order to create multiple overlapping exposures. The result obtained, a sort of cubist decomposition and recomposition of the form, made Jenny's work loved by architects all over the world. "Okun's photographs," said Frank Gehry, "go straight to the soul of architecture."

During her first visit to Lecce, Okun, attracted by the dramatic light reflected on the famous tuff stone of Lecce and the treasures of Baroque architecture scattered throughout Salento, created a series of photographs applying the technique that distinguishes her mainly to sumptuous churches of the city. In December 2011, Okun returned to Lecce to create a second series of works for the inaugural exhibition and the permanent collection of the Historical Museum of the City of Lecce.

"Looking at architecture" wrote Okun "is like listening to music. They are both dramatic artistic forms that reveal multiple and repetitive themes. And above all, both take time ... when I photograph a building, it is as if I was conducting with my camera while I explore the themes of the architect in space and time. The layering of overlapping harmonious forms creates new and playful variations on the theme of the original architecture ".

The photographs from 1999 were all conceived in the camera. In the last decade, however, Okun, a pioneer of digital printing of her work in the nineties, has replaced traditional photographic film with digital photography. A comparison between Lecce's photos from 1999 and those from 2011 reveals an evident expansion of his artistic vision, made possible in part by digital photographic technology. Now Okun combines her photographs taken on site all over the world with advanced digital manipulations in Photoshop to create unique images that are at the same time familiar but "said in other words". The freedom and control that Photoshop offers has not only brought a greater depth of sensations to Okun's work, they also allowed her to be able to confront each subject that attracts her attention. There are still buildings, yes, but also landscapes, gardens, sculptures and nudes, plants and animals that evoke, in the words of the curator Karen Sinsheimer "not only these realities in themselves but the subjective memory of Okun in the experimental".
